Nice to Know

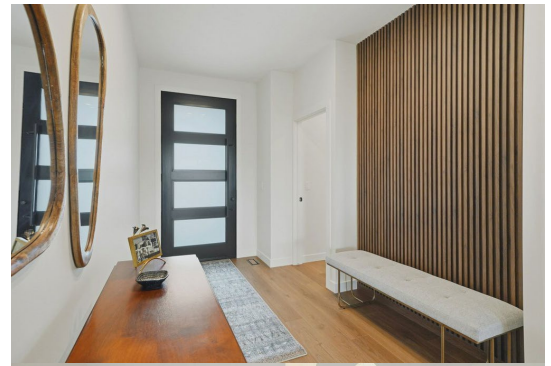
Lyle says most people know someone whose life has been touched by STARS, and the WestSource team is honoured to inspire support for STARS so more families across Saskatchewan can receive critical care during their most difficult and frightening moments. Every mission that STARS flies creates the possibility of more time, more memories and more life with loved ones. Lottery ticket purchasers help fund over one-third of STARS' annual operating needs, and the chance to win the Dream Home is just the bonus.

The Design

When WestSource was invited to build the 2026 Dream Home, they were inspired by STARS' mission: connecting the people of Saskatchewan to life-saving care in the most critical moments. That idea of connection guided their design of the home: connection to nature through floor-to-ceiling windows, connection to friends and family through an open concept and indoor-outdoor floor plan, and connection to self through functional spaces thoughtfully spread throughout the home.

Within the elevated bungalow, mid-century modern style meets modern living, with warm walnut cabinetry and shelves, plus WestSource's signature integrated LED accent lighting throughout the home. The house emphasizes sustainability and energy efficiency with an Insulated Concrete Form (ICF) foundation, insulated basement floors, high-performance fiberglass windows and doors, and a radon gas collection system.

Serbu Park: Home of the Pump Track

At the Regular Council Meeting on Monday, July 20, Council reviewed feedback from the public engagement survey and approved Serbu Park as the primary location for the pump track.

A total of 114 residents shared their feedback, with 51% selecting Serbu Park as their preferred location. The next highest choice (Federal Park) was selected by 13% of respondents.

Council considered the survey results alongside several factors that make Serbu Park a strong fit:

- A central, accessible location connected by existing pathways
- An established recreation hub with a skate park, playground, ball diamonds and open space
- Existing parking and washroom facilities
- An opportunity to support nearby local businesses
- A space that can be enjoyed by riders of different ages

The decision also aligns with the Town's Parks and Recreation Master Plan, which recommends enhancing Serbu Park with cycling-related recreation opportunities.

The modular pump track can be relocated in future years if community needs change. However, Serbu Park will remain the primary location unless Council directs otherwise. Maintaining a consistent location provides certainty for residents, helps establish the pump track as a recreation destination, and avoids unnecessary annual transportation and installation costs.

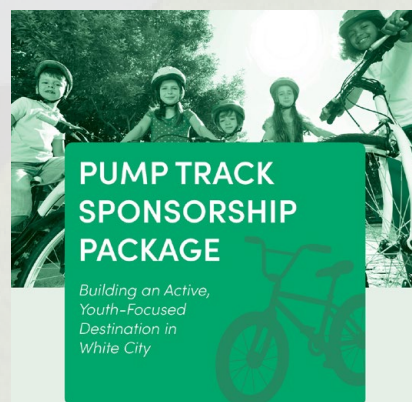

Special Event Grant

The Town is launching a new Special Event and Program Grant, available to eligible nonprofit groups. The funding is designed to support new or unique one-time events or programs that foster community pride, engagement, and spirit in the Town of White City.

Two funding streams are available:

Minor Grant Funding requests up to \$250	Major Grant Funding requests from \$250 to \$1,000
• Supports small-scale or introductory community events or programs. • Designed for organizations hosting a new or unique event with a limited scope or budget.	• Supports larger-scale community events or programs that demonstrate significant community benefit, reach, or impact.

Funding preference will be given to initiatives that directly benefit White City residents and align with the Town's Parks & Recreation Master Plan, including:

- Promoting a healthy, active, and inclusive community.
- Providing accessible opportunities for all ages and abilities.
- Enhancing trails, parks, and community gathering spaces.
- Expanding opportunities for events and celebrations.
- Supporting innovative and complementary amenities within the Town.

Block Party & Street Play Gatherings

Connect with your neighbours and foster a strong community by hosting a Block Party or Street Play gathering! Here's how:

1. **Determine the size and type of gathering:** Block Party events range from 10 people (Block Social) to a maximum of 200 people (Neighbourhood-Wide Block Party). Street Play gatherings depend on the types of play activities planned.
2. **Pick a location:** Events on private property do not require a Town permit, while gatherings on residential streets require a Town permit to temporarily close the road.
3. **Decide on the timing of your gathering:** Temporary road closures can take place between 9 am and 11 pm.
4. **Plan activities with your neighbours:** Reach out to neighbours to gauge their interest, ask for their input and build connections.
5. **Submit an application form:** If your gathering involves a road closure, submit a Block Party Application Form 14 days before your event. Events taking place on a Town roadway require proof of insurance. If street barricades are required, the Town will provide and deliver them.

The Town supports these events through permitting and can provide up to \$300 in financial support to help cover the costs of food, insurance and other expenses.

Completed Infrastructure Upgrades

Community Centre Shingles: Through a partnership between GAF and Optimum Roofing — which included grant funding for roofing materials, saving public funds — the community centre received a complete roofing system. Optimum Roofing, a GAF Master Elite® contractor based in Regina, lead the installation effort and completed the project in early July. The new shingles will help preserve the facility for years to come.



Double K Pathway Lighting: New lighting is now in place along the pathway from Briar Gate through Double K Park to Fernwood. The project also restored the non-functioning lights between Highway 48 and Briar Gate, and added additional lighting around the Double K facility to improve safety and visibility for recreation activities.

Support Our Slo Pitch League

Summer evenings are better at the ballpark! Head to Serbu Park on Monday and Thursday evenings to cheer on our Adult Slo-Pitch League. Games take place throughout the evening.

Don't forget to bring a lawn chair and your favourite beverage — Serbu Park is a designated Drinking in the Park space during specific Town programs and events, so adults 19+ may responsibly consume alcohol during games. Please plan a safe ride home.

Proposed Development: Parcel Y

The Town has received a proposal for a potential commercial development on Parcel Y that includes a hotel with an attached restaurant and a separate standalone restaurant.

About the Proposal

The proposal includes:

- A four-storey hotel (approximately 100 guest rooms)
- An attached restaurant with indoor seating, lounge and patio
- A standalone restaurant with a drive-through proposed as a future phase
- Parking, landscaping, and related site infrastructure

Public Engagement

Throughout July, the Town conducted public engagement, including:

- A public survey open from July 7 to July 31 asking for input on the proposal;
- Three focus groups with residents from different areas of Town exploring the future of Parcel Y; and
- One-to-one interviews with residents living adjacent to Parcel Y on McKenzie Pointe and McKenzie Landing.

The public engagement period has now concluded and we will share a “What We Heard” summary shortly.



Parcel Y is located east of Highway 48 and South of Highway 1, just north-east of the McKenzie Pointe neighbourhood. The land is zoned Highway/Commercial Industrial (HCI).

Understanding the Holding Provision

Parcel Y is currently subject to a holding provision under the Town's Zoning Bylaw. A holding provision is a planning tool that allows Council to defer certain development until it is satisfied that appropriate planning considerations have been reviewed.

Although the proposed hotel and restaurants are permitted uses within Parcel Y's current Zoning Designation (Highway/Commercial Industrial), the holding provision must be removed before development can proceed.

What's Next?

Currently, no decision has been made regarding approval in principle, the removal of the holding provision, or approval of the proposed development.

The next planning decision will be whether to grant approval in principle to proceed with the planning process. Council will consider several factors when making a decision, including community feedback along with applicable legislation, planning policies, technical information, and the long-term interests of the community.

Public Works

Upcoming Projects & Reminders

Public Works is continuing to tackle infrastructure maintenance projects to keep municipal assets functioning properly and White City looking its best. The department has welcomed several summer students to support crews during the busy summer season.

Here's what Public Works is focusing on this month:

- **Road Repairs:** Crews are milling out the old asphalt and laying new asphalt.
- **Drainage Improvement:** The team is completing a few drainage improvement projects in Town-owned ditches and easements to ensure White City's drainage system can keep up with storms and rainfall.
- **Mowing:** Public Works is working hard to complete mowing, trimming and park maintenance on an ongoing basis.

With increased activity on roads and in parks, please watch for Public Works crews and equipment, including mowers and other utility vehicles. Remember to slow down in work zones and use extra caution to help keep workers safe.

Warm Weather Composting Tips

Weekly compost pickup continues until the end of October. Here are some tips to limit compost odour and mess during the hot summer weather:



- Set your cart out for every collection, even if it isn't full.
- Sprinkle a small amount of vinegar or baking soda into your bin.
- Let leaves, grass, and yard waste dry out first before placing them into your cart.
- Alternate layers of food waste with layers of dried leaves, grass clippings, or dead plants.
- Rinse your bin occasionally with a garden hose.

Fall Community Cleanup: Key Dates

Our seasonal community cleanup services are fast approaching! The Town offers these special services twice per year to help residents declutter and keep their properties clean and tidy.

Please make note of the following dates and deadlines for Fall 2026:

- **Branch Chipping:** Place your branches curbside by **September 20**. Crews will start chipping the day after the deadline and will continue until every street has been completed once.
- **Leaf Bag Pick Up:** Crews will pick up bags between **October 12 to 23**. Remember to use biodegradable paper bags. For the safety of staff, please keep bags under 50 pounds.
- **Clean Up Bins:** From **October 21 to 29**, residents can drop off household waste, recycling and metal in the bins at the Splash Park on Lipsett Street.

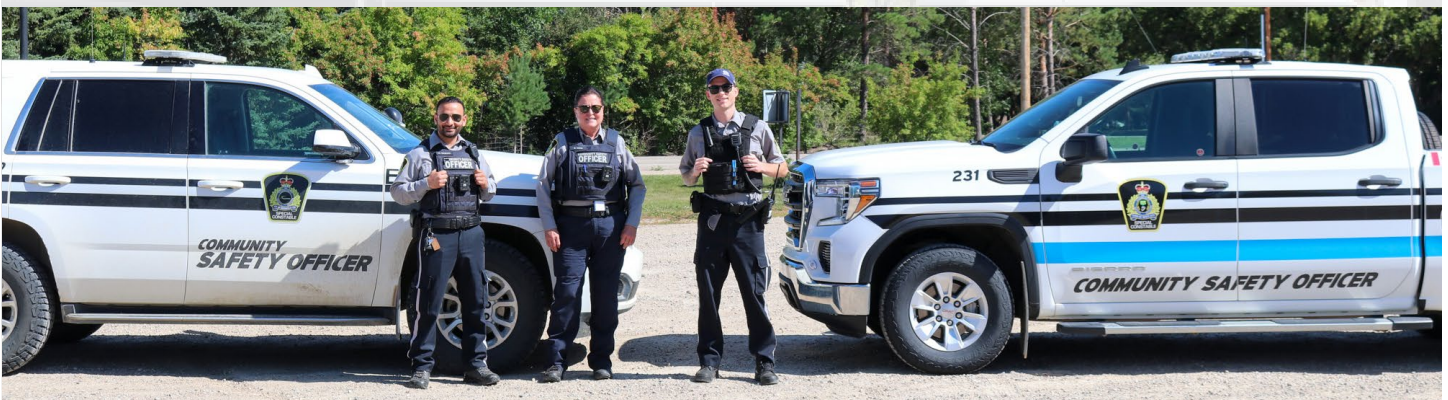

Tax & Utility

Save Money On Your Property Taxes

Reminder: the Town of White City offers a discount on the municipal portion of your property taxes if you pay early.

- Save 13% if you pay by August 31st
- Save 11% if you pay by September 30th
- Save 9% if you pay by October 31st

Tax payment must be received on or before October 31; if you're paying online, allow three to five business days for the Town to receive the payment. Starting November 1, a 1.5% interest penalty will be applied to any remaining unpaid taxes. Visit whitecity.ca/p/property-tax to learn more.
