2026 Annual Budget

The 2026 Annual Budget was adopted by Council on January 6, 2026. Budget figures are available via the Town's CivicWeb portal and the complete budget document will be publicly available on the Town's website in the coming months. In the meantime, here are some key figures from the 2026 Annual Budget!

Welcome to Nice to Know—a section of our newsletter where we'll share a little something extra each month. Sometimes it might be a quick tip or fun fact. Other times, we'll have more to share—like updates on major capital projects happening around town. Whether it's a quick tidbit or a deep dive, this is your spot for useful info that helps you stay in the know about what's happening in White City.

A municipal budget is a financial plan that outlines the expected revenues and expenditures of a local government over a specific period of time, typically a fiscal year. It details how funds will be allocated to provide public services, infrastructure projects, and operational expenses. Municipal budgets typically cover areas such as governance, recreation, culture, public works, planning, environmental services, protective services and other services essential to the community's well-being. The budgeting process involves assessing needs, setting priorities, and making decisions to ensure the responsible and effective use of public funds.

White City's 2026 Annual Budget has been prepared with a focus on maintaining service levels for the municipality and its residents whilst balancing management of infrastructure and assets.

In White City, 76% of properties fall within the taxable assessment value of \$450.0K to \$800.0K. or these properties, the annual increase to taxes will range between \$165.84 and \$217.04. If a resident takes advantage of the full 15% tax discount, this drops to an annual increase ranging between \$140.96 and \$184.48.

Public Works

Upcoming Projects & Reminders

Unpredictable winter weather keeps our Public Works team busy! Here are a few projects the department is focusing on:

- Snow Removal: Crews are clearing snow from roadways, sidewalks and public areas to keep routes safe for drivers and pedestrians.
- Ice Management: Public Works continues to monitor drainage systems to prevent ice buildup that can lead to hazardous conditions.
- Rink Maintenance: Staff are maintaining and flooding the Town's outdoor skating rinks, Crokicurl pad, and skating trail so residents can enjoy winter recreation. The Town typically floods outdoor rinks every weekday morning. When staff are flooding the rink, please stay off the ice and keep a safe distance from equipment.

And another friendly reminder: when you're putting your garbage or recycling bin out for pickup, please make sure it's on your property, not the road edge.



Planning & Development

Business Licenses

Don't forget! The annual deadline to renew business licenses is approaching. If you already have a business license, you must renew it by February 28, 2026. New business license applications are accepted anytime.

A few important points:

- Home-based businesses need Council approval and must comply with zoning regulations. If your business has changed or you haven't applied yet, you'll need to submit a new application.
- Every business needs to renew their business license each year. If you've missed a year or haven't been renewing consistently, you'll need to re-apply with the Town.

SGI Traffic Safety Grant

In 2025, White City secured \$20,863.71 from SGI's Provincial Traffic Safety Fund Grant, and we've put that money to work!

Thanks to this funding, we've installed two new traffic safety initiatives:

- A new Rectangular Rapid Flashing Beacon (RRFB) Pedestrian Crosswalk system on White City Drive just south of the Kingsmere Ave intersection, making it easier and safer for pedestrians to cross with solar-powered push button lights that alert drivers. The crosswalk system costs approximately \$14,500, with additional money allocated for concrete pile installation by a contractor.
- A Radar Speed Display Sign on Kingsmere Avenue near École White City School to encourage safer speeds and driving habits. The speed radar sign costs approximately \$5,000 and is connected to the Traffic Logix monitoring system that the Town uses to evaluate traffic and speed data throughout the community.

Keeping our community safe is a top priority, and these upgrades help protect pedestrians and calm traffic in busy areas. A huge thank you to SGI and our amazing Public Works department for making these projects happen!

Enforcing Stop Sign Stops

Our Community Service Officer (CSO) has recently observed an increase in drivers failing to stop at stop signs in White City.

To address this safety concern, the CSO has been issuing warnings and citations to drivers as appropriate. Observation and enforcement will continue at intersections throughout Town, with particular attention on frequent problem areas like Lott Road E and Emerald Hill Drive.


This is a friendly reminder that stop signs are there to protect everyone: drivers, pedestrians, and cyclists alike. Always come to a complete stop and proceed only when it is safe to do so. Taking a moment to stop can prevent serious accidents.

In addition to safety risks, failure to stop at a stop sign can result in a \$230 fine and 4 points off your license. Thank you for doing your part to drive responsibly and keep our community safe.
