# **Council Summaries**

#### March 4, 2024 - Committee of the Whole

The Consent Agenda included approval of previous meeting minutes, accounts, and a denied appeal from the Building Standards Appeal. Financial Reports approved a payment to Automated AV for alarm monitoring. The Administration Report brought up discussion of collaboration with the RM of Edenwold for protective services during garage sale weekend. The Consumption of Alcohol in Outdoor Spaces Bylaw was reviewed with considerations for additional fines and engagement. Next, there was a discussion on repealing and replacing the Curfew Bylaw to support the Crime Watch Group. Then the Parks, Recreation and Culture Activity Report was presented and Committee members discussed focusing on improving communications, tracking metrics, volunteerism, and facility usage. The Committee directed administration to collaborate on protective services with the RM for Garage Sale Weekend, referred the Alcohol Bylaw back for further review, recommended the Curfew Bylaw for adoption, and discussed various improvements and collaborations for future events and programs.

#### March 4, 2024 - Regular Council Meeting

The Consent Agenda, including minutes and accounts, was approved after addressing a question about a cheque related to water analysis for the utility rate review. The Town Manager provided an update on boundary alteration, wastewater authority, and planning and community development. Discussions on Tax Enforcement led to the referral of the item back to administration for an updated list with civic addresses. The approval of a Loader Tender focused on the net financial benefit, operational advantages, and the sale of old equipment covering the cost of the new unit. The appointment of a fundraising committee for the Multi-Use Recreation Centre involved requesting criminal record checks from applicants. Long Term Borrowing Bylaw discussions covered aspects including application to the Saskatchewan Municipal Board, the town's debt limit, and potential payment methods if no development occurs. The meeting also reviewed various items, including the Total Compensation Review, WCRM158 Wastewater Management Authority Operational Funding Request, 2024 SUMA Voting Delegates, and Fee Bylaw Amendment, all of which were approved. The Roundtable discussion included updates on the White City Museum, Emergency Measures Organizations, Youth Advisory Committee, Johnson Shoyama Graduate Studies Course, Lions Club Blitz, and a Tyler Smith virtual mental health event.

#### March 18, 2024 - Committee of the Whole

At the start of the meeting, the agenda was amended to include an item on Camp Molly. Presentations included updates from the Lions Club on the formation of a local branch and from the Emergency Measures Organization Coordinator on action plan items. Committee members discussed the distribution of the White City inSight newsletter and the potential to transition to a digital format. Finance provided updates on loans and interest rate swaps, clarifying that mandatory changes would not affect payments. Camp Molly terminology was discussed, and reminders from community groups were shared during the Roundtable, including updates from the Youth Advisory Committee, Public Works, the White City Library, and upcoming events such as the Community Wellness Expo.

The next Committee of the Whole meeting is on April 2, 2024 at 4 PM. The next Regular Council meeting is on April 2, 2024 at 7 PM. Please note there is no Committee of the Whole meeting on April 15, 2024.

# **Public Works**

## **Spring Melt Reminders**

April is prime time for water accumulation and even flooding! To prevent these issues from happening this spring, there are a few things you can do to assist the efforts of Public Works staff and ensure proper water drainage in our streets.

If you know where the drainage area on your property is, keep it clear of ice and snow in order for water to drain effectively.

Also, ensure the U-Channels on your driveway are free of ice to prevent flooding of roadways.

Rest assured Public Works staff have been working hard opening drains and clearing U-Channels to ensure a smooth snow melt season!





## Time to Branch Out

Branch chipping begins Monday April 29 and will continue until Friday May 10. Public Works Staff will be driving around collecting and chipping branches that are set out.

Please have your branches placed neatly on the curb before May 5, 2024. Place the stump or largest part of the branch facing the street, this makes it easier for staff to grab the branches and feed them into the chipper.

Town staff is limited to 30 minutes per property. There is no set route and Public Works will do one final check to make sure they have collected all the piles set out before May 5.

## REMINDER

Leaf Bag Pickup begins May 13.

ONLY paper bags will be accepted. Absolutely no plastic bags will be collected, including those that labelled biodegradable and compostable.

## Front End Loader, Front and Centre

Public Works' new Front End Loader has arrived and is already being put to good use. The main purpose of the loader is to help with snow removal due to the 4-in-1 snow blade and a snow blower attachment.

This machine will significantly improve snow removal efforts in the winter months. It's not just limited to snow, however. It will also be used year-round for duties such as capital projects, hauling dirt and loading trucks and trailers.


