Planning & Development

Landscaping Inspections

When homes are built in White City, builders must pay a landscaping deposit to the Town to ensure each property is properly graded and landscaped. This is crucial because the Town has an overland drainage system that relies on grassed and maintained ditches to slow down water runoff and prevent flooding.

The good news? Once your landscaping is completed and approved, eligible property owners receive that deposit back. Depending on the property, your refund is typically between \$400 and \$2,000.

2026 is the last year for outstanding properties to finish landscaping. After November 1, 2026, properties will be subject to enforcement measures. Completing landscaping work ensures you receive your full deposit refund and avoid enforcement action. To qualify for your refund, all required landscaping must be finished to grade, including:

- Front, rear and side yards
- Ditch area
- Necessary tree planting
- Installation of a hard-surface driveway

Please remember, before starting any work, you must obtain a landscaping permit. Once all landscaping is complete, you must request a landscaping inspection from the Town.

Inspections take place May 30 to September 30 (weather permitting). To request an inspection, email townoffice@whitecity.ca.

Boundary Alteration Approved

On February 6, 2026, the Town of White City received approval from the Ministry of Government Relations to restructure its municipal boundaries through the annexation of 199.79 hectares of land from the Rural Municipality (RM) of Edenwold No. 158.

The boundary alteration application received support from the RM of Edenwold's Council, who issued a complementary resolution on December 16, 2025. As part of the approval process, the Town and the RM negotiated a voluntary restructuring agreement.

This restructuring was requested by the landowner, and aligns with White City's long-term growth strategy, ensuring the Town has adequate and appropriate supply of land to accommodate projected residential and commercial needs. For more information, visit whitecity.ca/p/2025-boundary-alteration.

Town Centre Update


At the February 2, 2026 Regular Council Meeting, Council approved amendments to the Official Community Plan (OCP) and Zoning Bylaw to accommodate medium-density, multi-unit residential development within the Town Centre.

These amendments implement long-standing policy direction established through the Town Centre Neighbourhood Plan and are intended to support a range of housing types within the Town Centre as the community grows. Public Works

Upcoming Projects & Reminders

The late winter season keeps our Public Works Department busy!

March Operations Priorities:

- Snow Clearing: Public Works will continue clearing snow from roads and public areas as needed to ensure safe travel conditions.
- Snow Piles: Crews will be hauling away snow piles to manage the accumulation of snow.
- Spring Runoff: As the days get warmer and snow begins to melt, Public Works will manage spring runoff by opening drainage channels, exposing culverts and steaming where necessary.

The department would like to remind residents that U-channels and drainage ditches located on private property are the responsibility of the property owner. They should be cleared to ensure proper drainage during the spring melt.

Weekly Compost Pickup Returns April

This month's date for compost pickup is March 24.

Beginning in April, residents can once again set out yard waste and household organics for weekly pickup. Compost collection is scheduled for every Tuesday from April until November, after which compost pickup goes back to once per month.

2026 Loraas Collection Schedules are available at the Town Office and on our website. For more information, visit whitecity.ca/p/composting.

Acceptable Compost Items:

- Food scraps, including egg shells, bones, fruit and vegetable peelings and plate scrapings
- Cut flowers
- Unbagged lawn clippings
- Unbagged leaves
- Coffee grounds, filters and tea bags
- Dryer lint and vacuum dust
- Soiled cardboard



Items Not Accepted:

- Fat, grease or liquids
- Packaging
- Rocks, dirt or soil
- Construction waste
- Plastic bags or styrofoam
- Tree cuttings larger than 1" thick or longer than 2 feet

Community Safety

January 2025 Statistics

- 16 traffic stops conducted
 - 9 tickets issued
 - 3 tickets for speeding
 - 6 tickets for disobeying a stop sign
 - 4 warnings issued for speeding
 - 3 warnings for disobeying a stop sign
 - 1 warning for driving an unregistered vehicle
 - 1 warning for viewing electronic device while driving
 - 1 traffic evade forwarded to RCMP for driving an ATV with no helmet, stunting and driving double the speed limit

 - 3 parking reminders

The inSight newsletter is created around the 15th of each month. Publishing CSO statistics from January in March aligns with the newsletter production schedule, allowing time for thorough data analysis and timely inclusion in the current edition. February 2026 statistics will be available in the Q2 (April) 2026 edition.

2025 Traffic Enforcement Numbers

- In 2025, the CSO issued 109 Summary Offence Traffic Information (SOTIs), conducted 184 traffic stops, and issued \$29.2K in fines.
- Of the tickets issued, 9 were issued to White City residents (totaling \$2.1K) and 100 were issued to non-residents (totaling \$27.2K).
- Offenses included 78 regular speeding tickets, 7 tickets for driving more than 35 km/h over the speed limit, 2 tickets for driving double the posted limit, and 13 tickets for speeding in a school zone.

Speeding accounts for approximately 92% of all tickets issued in 2025, making it the dominant safety concern in 2025. These statistics are more than numbers – they represent real safety risks. Speed limits are in place to protect everyone who uses our roads, including pedestrians, cyclists, and fellow drivers.

While visiting and through-traffic behaviour remain a primary contributor to traffic violations within Town limits, we can all contribute to safe driving habits. We remind all residents and visitor to slow down, obey speed limits and use extra caution in school zones.
