Sportsfields and Park Bookings

We do not yet have confirmed opening dates for sport fields due to weather conditions, but we are beginning to schedule bookings for the upcoming season to support safe and organized use.

A Sport Field Application is required for use of outdoor sport fields, including École White City School, Emerald Ridge School, Emerald Ridge Park, Wheatland Park, Hummingbird Park, Serbu Ball Diamonds, RidgeDale Park, and Confederation/Federal Park.

Submitting a request helps coordinate field use, manage parking, and reduce congestion.

This is not a rental process, and spaces remain public with no guaranteed exclusivity.

Please note:

- Insurance documentation is required from sports organizations prior to permit approval
- There is no application fee
- Approved requests receive a Park Permit for scheduled use

Our goal is to ensure fair, safe, and organized access to community spaces.

Applications should be submitted to our Sport and Facility Coordinator Summer Student for processing at adoig@whitecity.ca.

Updates on field openings will be shared on our social media and website. Coaches who have submitted applications will also be contacted directly once fields are open for use.

Where to Park

Please be advised that on-street parking in White City is not permitted. Residents are instead encouraged to use the Wheatland Park parking lot (indicated by orange dots on the map below). If this lot is full, additional parking is available at Fernwood Park.

Please adhere to the signage in these locations. Violators will be towed.



For any additional overflow parking, please use the Double K Skating Arena lot (indicated on the map to the right). From there, residents may walk to the park.

The Town appreciates your cooperation and understanding, as we are aware parking space is limited. Thank you for your attention to this matter.

Arbor Week & Tree City of the World

May 25 to 31 is Arbor Week! This annual celebration recognizes the incredible positive impact trees have on our community, homes, and health.

We're proud to announce that White City has been recognized as a Tree City of the World for the fifth year in a row. Tree Cities of the World is a programme partnership between the Arbor Day Foundation and the Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations (FAO). This global recognition highlights our community's ongoing commitment to caring for our urban forest, ensuring our trees are sustainably managed and celebrated for generations to come.

The Town has developed a comprehensive Urban Forest Management Plan to ensure White City is a leader in caring for (and celebrating) urban trees. The plan outlines planting and pruning recommendations for over 3700 publicly-owned trees within city limits.

Our urban forest provides a huge benefit to residents:

- Shade relief
- Stormwater runoff mitigation
- Water retention and filtration
- Air purification
- Reducing noise pollution
- Aesthetics and increased property values

As a friendly reminder, private trees cannot be planted on municipal property – please let the Town take care of planting, managing and maintaining trees on public land. Tax & Utility

Leak Detection

As the weather continues to warm, we wanted to remind residents to thoroughly examine your property's outdoor water infrastructure for leaks. Upon startup, be sure to check your hose bibs, irrigation systems, ponds, pools and/or fountains.

For several years, there's been a measurable increase in water leaks every spring due to the nature of these systems. We recommend proactively inspecting all outdoor lines and valves to ensure they are in good working order. Don't forget to review your sprinkler system's timer to make sure the times are set adequately.

Tax Levy

Property taxes are being levied in May! Your tax notice will be heading your way shortly, based on the delivery method you've previously selected. If you've opted into e-notices for taxes and you've registered for the Customer Portal, you will receive your notice via the Customer Portal.

If you haven't received your notice by the end of the month, please contact or visit the Town Office so we can assist you.

Want to save some money? Pay early and get a discount on the municipal portion of your taxes:

- 15% if paid by July 31st
- 13% if paid by August 31st
- 11% if paid by September 30th
- 9% if paid by October 31st

Tax payment must be received on or before October 31; if you're paying online, make sure to allow three to five business days for the Town to receive the payment. Starting November 1, a 1.5% interest penalty will be applied to any remaining unpaid taxes.

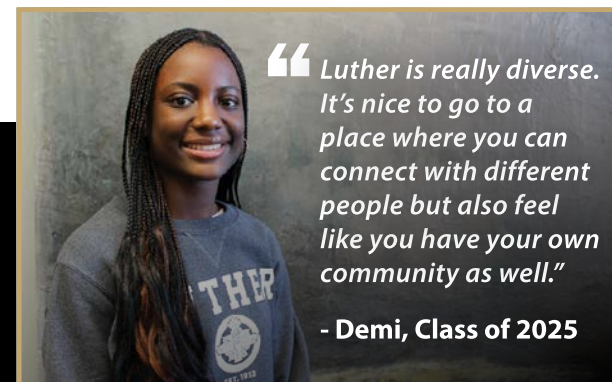
Customer Portal

Have you registered for White City's Customer Portal?

Since launching last November, 698 residents have signed up for the portal. That means approximately 55% of residents are enjoying the convenience of receiving property tax notices and utility bills online. Together, this shift has already saved the Town over \$860 in paper and postage in the last six months.

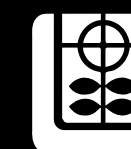

Public Works

Upcoming Projects & Reminders

After a lingering winter, our Public Works team is gearing up to get our community ready for spring and summer! With a busy season ahead, here's what the department has going on:

- Seasonal Community Cleaning Programs: See the information below for details on Leaf Bag Pick Up and Clean Up Bins.
- Rodent and Pest Control: Trained crews are working to ensure everyone can enjoy the outdoors comfortably this season.
- Fertilizing: Fertilizer will give our parks and green spaces a healthy boost, keeping them lush and inviting for residents and visitors alike.
- Irrigation: Systems are being hooked up to support operations through the warmer months.
- Weed Spraying: This will take place when weather conditions allow. We'll share additional updates and post signage so you know where crews are working.
- Street Sweeping: After a winter that overstayed its welcome, street sweeping is scheduled for early May.
- Traffic Line Painting: Please be patient and watch for Town vehicles, pylons and staff on the roads.
- Pothole Repairs: Following a tough and drawn-out winter, crews will be giving our roads some TLC to make your drive smoother and safer.
- Tree Planting: Planting continues with Phase 3 of the Trans Canada Trail Planting Plan. This year's planting will take place east of Motherwell Drive, heading toward the retention pond.
- Garden Club Support: Public Works will help the White City Garden Club with flowerpot hydrating and prepping for planting.



A quick reminder: compost pickup is now weekly until the end of October. It's a great time to make the most of your green bin and help reduce waste. For tips and details about composting in White City, visit whitecity.ca/p/composting.

Seasonal Cleanup Programs

Leaf Bag Pick Up - May 11-22, 2026

Please place your bags neatly at the curb by May 20, 2026.

Remember, only paper bags (biodegradable and compostable) will be picked up – plastic bags will not be collected.

For the safety of Town staff, please make sure bags weigh less than 50 lbs. Crews are limited to 30 minutes per property.

Clean Up Bins - May 20-28, 2026

Bins for household waste, metal and recycling will be located at the Splash Park on Lipsett Street.

Please obey signage and separate your items into the appropriate bins. If you're unsure which bin to use, place your items in the household/mixed waste bins.

Do not overfill bins and do not leave any garbage on the ground next to bins. If a bin is full, please hold on to your items until it's emptied.

Responsible Pet Ownership

The Town's *Responsible Pet Ownership Bylaw* keeps both animals and residents safe and happy, with clear rules that address registration, control and common nuisances like excessive noise or waste. It also outlines how ticketing and enforcement work. Whether you're a long-time pet owner or considering adding a furry friend to your family, understanding these rules helps create a safer, more respectful community for all. Here's a few key points to be aware of:

Keep Your Dog Leashed:

Dogs must always be under their owner's control – either on a leash or securely contained on your property. There are no off-leash dog parks in White City. Dogs must remain leashed in all parks and public spaces. Please ensure the person holding the leash can physically control the dog.

Avoid Excessive Barking:

If your dog is barking or howling for 15 minutes or longer OR intermittently for an hour or more, it is considered a nuisance and you could receive a ticket. If your dog is barking, especially late at night, please bring them indoors.

Don't Let Your Cat Roam:

To protect both pets and wildlife, cats are not permitted to roam freely in the neighbourhood. Please keep your cats indoors or supervise them in a secure, enclosed outdoor area.

The Lily Beetle Battle

Dr. James Tansey, provincial insect specialist
Saskatchewan Ministry of Agriculture



Dr. Tansey will bring us up to date with what the prairie provinces and specifically Saskatchewan are doing to battle the Red Lily Beetle. This beetle is well known to our club members as it continues to attack our garden lilies. Our provincial Western Red Lily is also in danger from this insect which has spread across our country from east to west initially thought to have been imported via Easter Lilies from Asia. We will hear about research being done using natural predators.
