Parks, Rec & Culture

Parks and Outdoor Facilities Update

Due to weather conditions this spring, there was a delayed start to the outdoor recreation season. We appreciate the patience and flexibility of community groups and residents as seasonal operations were impacted.

All sport fields, parks, and ball diamonds are now fully operational.

Significant work has also been completed at the Serbu Ball Diamonds, including:

- Repairs to all three diamonds' fencing
- Repairs to backstops
- Installation of new shale
- Restoration of bases to proper elevation
- Replacement and installation of new bases where required
- Improvements to pitching mounds
- Seeding and restoration of surrounding areas around the diamond

These improvements support safer play, improved field conditions, and an enhanced experience for local teams and user groups throughout the season.

Splash Park Opening

Get ready to make a splash — the Splash Park is officially opening on June 6, 2026!

Join us at Summer Sizzle's Family Fun Day to mark the occasion and celebrate with activities for everyone. Don't forget to bring your swimsuit.

The Splash Park is open from 10:00 am to 8:00 pm daily throughout the season and typically closes mid-September.



Portable Washrooms

Portable washrooms have been added to several Town parks to improve accessibility, enhance the usability of park spaces, and ensure residents and visitors have more comfortable access to amenities throughout the community.

Washrooms have been added to the following locations:

- Fernwood Park (near the pickleball and tennis courts)
- Wheatland Park
- Bronco Park (by the lift station)

A washroom for the Splash Park is still to come.

We Want Your Input: Pump Track

The Town plans to install a pump track by Fall 2026 to offer a new youth-oriented recreation amenity that provides a safe space for youth to enjoy biking and other wheeled activities. Council has officially approved a modular pump track design. The next step is determining the most suitable location for installation, and we are seeking community input before a final decision is made.

A key benefit of a modular pump track is its flexibility. The track can be taken down, relocated, and reinstalled in a different location if needed. As the community grows and changes over time, the pump track can adapt and move to continue meeting recreational needs.

The following potential locations are being considered:

A minimum 40-metre setback from adjacent property lines will be maintained at all locations to help reduce potential impacts on nearby residents.

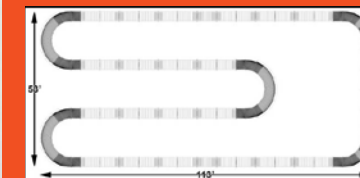

Proposed Design

Below is a mock design of the proposed configuration. The layout is flexible and components can be adjusted, rearranged, or reconfigured to better suit the chosen site and user experience. Please note that the final installed feature may vary slightly from the concept shown.



Batting Cages: Now Complete

The Town's upgraded batting cages are officially ready for action! Construction recently wrapped up on the project. As a result, Serbu Park now features four batting cages in total – two improved existing cages and two brand new additions – creating an enhanced space for baseball and softball players of all ages to practice and play.

Thank you to White Butte Minor Ball (WBMB) for their generous support in funding the project. Their contribution will strengthen youth programming and community recreation opportunities. In recognition of this support, the Town will waive usage fees for WBMB up to the value of their financial contribution.



Community Centre Reshingling

Important maintenance upgrades will be taking place at the Community Centre this spring and summer as the Town moves forward with a re-shingling project designed to protect and preserve one of the community's key gathering spaces. The existing shingles on the Community Centre roof will be replaced to help prevent weather-related damage, extend the life of the facility for years to come, and give the building a refreshed appearance.

The 2026 Budget allocated \$60,000 for the project; thanks to grant funding, the Town approved a proposal from Optimum Roofing to complete the re-shingling for approximately \$23,000. Work is scheduled for Spring–Summer 2026.

Double K Pathway Lighting

This summer, residents will see improvements to pathway lighting from Briar Gate through Double K Park to Fernwood Park. Existing, non-functional lights between Highway 48 and Briar Gate will be repaired. Additional lighting will also be added around Double K Recreation Facility, helping to better illuminate this popular winter recreation area and improve visibility during the colder months.

As part of the Town's ongoing commitment to safety, accessibility, and recreation, this project will create a continuous, well-lit route that makes it easier and safer for residents to enjoy walking, biking, and outdoor activities.

With a project budget of \$75,000, construction is scheduled for Spring/Summer 2026. Once complete, residents can look forward to a brighter, safer, and more welcoming space to stay active and connected year-round.

Coming Soon: WBM Walking Tour

The White Butte Museum (WBM) Walking Tour will be expanding with three new locations in the coming weeks. Residents are encouraged to stay tuned for updates, including the official release date and grand opening details, which will be shared on both the WBM website and the Town's website.

Public Works

Upcoming Projects & Reminders

As we head into the summer months, the Public Works Department will begin seasonal maintenance projects to help keep our community safe, clean, and enjoyable throughout the season.


Residents will notice the start of regular mowing in parks and green spaces across the community. Weed control activities will also begin, and spraying operations may take place when weather conditions are favorable.

Crews will continue ongoing maintenance of the community ball diamonds to ensure they remain in good condition for summer activities and events.

Road maintenance programs will also ramp up this month, including:

- Pothole repairs;
- Crack sealing; and
- Line painting.

With increased activity on roads and in parks, residents are reminded to watch for Public Works crews and equipment, including mowers and other utility vehicles. Please slow down in work zones and use extra caution to help keep workers safe.

 Don't forget, compost pickup is weekly until the end of October. Do you struggle with compost odour and mess during the hot summer weather? Check out our website for tips to beat the heat: whitecity.ca/p/composting.

Community Planning

Landscaping Deposit Refunds

Did you know you can get your landscaping deposit back? When homes are built in White City, builders provide a landscaping deposit to the Town to ensure each property is properly graded and landscaped. The good news for homeowners: once your landscaping is completed and approved, eligible property owners receive that deposit back. Depending on the property, your refund is typically between \$400 and \$2,000.

To qualify for your refund, all required landscaping must be finished to grade, including:

- Front, rear and side yards
- Ditch area
- Necessary tree planting
- Installation of a hard-surface driveway

Please remember to obtain a landscaping permit before starting any work. Once all landscaping is complete, you must request a landscaping inspection from the Town. Inspections take place May 30 to September 30 (weather permitting). To request an inspection, email townoffice@whitecity.ca. To learn more, visit whitecity.ca/p/driveways-landscaping-fences.

Riding E-Bikes & E-Scooter Legally

As warmer weather brings more people outside, it's important to know the rules for operating e-scooters and e-bikes safely and legally. The RCMP and Community Safety Officers (CSOs) from White City and the RM of Edenwold will be conducting education and enforcement throughout the season to help ensure riders are complying with the law and operating safely. Please take a moment to review the requirements below.

E-Bikes (Power-Assisted Bicycles)

E-bikes are regulated under the *Traffic Safety Act* and the *Vehicle Equipment Regulations*. Riders must:

- Be at least 14 years old
- Wear an approved helmet
- Follow all rules outlined in the *Traffic Safety Act*
- Ensure the e-bike meets required equipment and safety standards

E-Scooters (Electric Kick Scooters)

E-scooters fall under the *Limited Speed Motor Vehicle Regulations*, so the rules are a bit different than e-bikes. Riders must:

- Be at least 16 years old (driver's licence not required)
- Wear an approved helmet
- Operate only on roads with speed limits of 50 km/h or less
- Follow all rules outlined in the *Traffic Safety Act*

Penalties

Failure to comply with these rules may result in fines, including:

- \$150 ticket for riders under 14 operating an e-bike
- \$100 ticket for not wearing an approved helmet while driving or riding an e-scooter or e-bike

E-Bike Helmet Requirements

As outlined in the legislation, all e-bike riders and passengers and all e-scooter operators must wear motorcycle helmets or bicycle helmets that meet one of the following approved standards:

Approved Motorcycle Helmets

- Canadian Standards Association;
- British Standards Institution;
- American National Standards Institute;
- United States Department of Transport;
- Snell Memorial Foundation; or
- Economic Commission for Europe

Approved Bicycle Helmets

- Canadian Standards Association;
- Snell Memorial Foundation;
- American National Standards Institute; or
- American Society of Testing and Material Standards

Pay Property Taxes Early to Save





Property taxes were levied in mid-May! Want to save some money? Pay early and get a discount on the municipal portion of your taxes:

Tax payment must be received on or before October 31; if you're paying online, allow three to five business days for the Town to receive the payment. Starting November 1, a 1.5% interest penalty will be applied to any remaining unpaid taxes. Visit whitecity.ca/p/property-tax to learn more.
