3 scams AI is making harder to spot



Artificial intelligence (AI) is often talked about in terms of how it's revolutionized different industries—that's certainly true for fraud. Cybercriminals have enthusiastically adopted AI tools to enhance their attacks. Here are just some of the scams that the technology is empowering:

The grandparent scam: Now, with the help of AI

tools, a fraudster with access to enough footage of someone via their social media can convincingly impersonate their voice on a call or even in video chat. A fraudster calls their target, often a senior, posing as one of their grandchildren who's in trouble. They need money now and it needs to be kept secret.

Identity theft: With AI to do the heavy lifting for them,

fraudsters can much more efficiently look through bulk data for enough information to select a target. One of their favourite tactics is claiming that there's an issue with the person's tax return—if they can get access to their tax forms, that gives them all the information they need to completely compromise that person's identity.

Phishing: This tactic has come a long way from emails from overseas princes filled with spelling mistakes. AI tools are making targeted attacks called "spear phishing" much easier. Fraudsters can include many more personal details to make their fake communications more convincing. For instance, they could even emulate the writing style of someone the target knows.

Keeping your identity safe in a world of AI-powered

fraud takes staying a step ahead of the scammers. One way to do this is by using digital tools, like Telus Online Security, which protects your identity and can also help you recover it if it's stolen. Try this whole-grain breakfast power bowl to fight inflammation

According to Arthritis Society Canada, these nutrient-dense ingredients may even play a role in managing inflammation and supporting your overall wellness.

For a nourishing start that goes the distance, dig into this healthy bowl to fuel your morning and keep you going strong all day.

5-Grain Breakfast Power Bowl

Prep time: 5 minutes • Cook time: 8-15 minutes
Servings: 6

Ingredients:

- ½ tbsp (7.5 ml) extra virgin olive oil
- 2 tbsp (30 ml) chia seeds
- 4 tbsp (60 ml) hemp hearts
- 1/3 cup (85 ml) whole grain rolled oats
- ½ cup (120 ml) white or red quinoa
- 1/3 cup (85 ml) wild rice, rinsed
- ¼ cup (60 ml) dried fruit
(raisins, dried cranberries or apricots)
- 1 tbsp (15 ml) ground cinnamon
- ¼ tsp (1.25 ml) ground ginger
- ¼ tsp (1.25 ml) salt
- 2 ½ cups (625 ml) almond milk (or milk of choice)
- 1 ½ (375 ml) cups water
- 2 tbsp (30 ml) maple syrup (optional)
- Cashews (optional)
- Fresh fruit of choice

Directions:

1. In a medium pot over medium heat, sauté chia seeds and hemp hearts in olive oil for 2 minutes.
2. Add quinoa, oats, rice, dried fruit, cinnamon, ginger, salt, milk and water. Mix well.
3. Cook for 10-14 minutes, until the grains are softened.
4. Serve with additional milk, fresh fruit, maple syrup and cashews, if desired.

Tips to give your power bowl an extra boost:

- **Rinse your quinoa:** This removes its natural coating and prevents bitterness.



- **Meal prep:** Make a batch and portion it into jars or containers for the week ahead.
- **Switch up the milk:** Use cashew, coconut or hemp milk fortified with calcium and vitamin D.
- **Increase the nutrition:** Top with extra hemp hearts for added protein and fibre.

Building Community, One Connection at a Time

Leadership in Action: A Day of Training, A Future of Readiness

On April 18, our region witnessed something pretty remarkable. Multiple emergency response agencies came together with one shared goal, to strengthen how we respond when it matters most.

a driver collided with a truck transporting hazardous industrial chemicals. It was carefully designed to test every level of response, from what happens on scene at the incident to the support from Emergency



More than 100 people were involved, backed by over 800 hours of planning that took place over the course of a year. This type of hands-on, real-life training has been talked about for years, and it was great to see it finally come together.

From what I understand, this was the largest mock emergency training event ever held in the province. I was very grateful to be part of it and to put my Incident Command System training into action at the EOC. The feedback from participants has been incredibly positive, with many describing it as a valuable learning experience. As the Fire Chief of Balgonie said, "we're about 92% there," while another participant summed it up as "17 touchdowns and 4 interceptions." Not everything went perfectly, but that's exactly the point of training like this.

I feel this type of exercise is especially important for our area. We have a large and growing

region, with the Number 1 Highway running right through it, along with multiple rail lines. These realities add to both the volume and complexity of potential emergencies, making preparation and coordination so important.

I would like to extend my sincere thanks to our emergency responders. Many of you volunteer your time to serve and protect, and your dedication truly does not go unnoticed.



This large-scale training exercise was all about building a strong foundation. It helped establish a baseline of knowledge across all responding agencies, highlighted areas where more training could be beneficial, and supported future planning within our fire departments. It also focused on improving communication, coordination, and teamwork across our agencies, communities, and overall response structure.

The scenario itself was both realistic and complex. A school bus carrying nine students and

Operations Centre (EOC). In fact, it felt so real that people passing by actually believed a major accident had taken place and began alerting others. That really speaks to the level of detail and effort that went into planning this exercise.

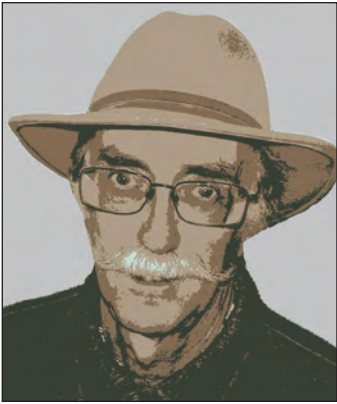

Off the Beaten Track

Our two local municipal councils have responded to enthusiastic outbursts from members of the public at council meetings and public hearings. From the Town of White City, a criminal investigation. From the RM of Edenwold, a review of procedural bylaws.

The issue is not, however, unique to our place and time. What follows is a satirical column written by your faithful correspondent about a similar issue in another place long, long ago. It was fictitious then, and is in no way a reflection upon our local councils, councillors or members of the public today. I repeat: it was fiction. Okay, it was partly fiction.
