Block Parties build connections and relationships between neighbours living on the same street. Street Play brings neighbours together for celebration or play. Both allow neighbours to gather on residential streets that are closed off to vehicle traffic.

The Town both supports Block Party and Street Play gatherings through planning, operations, and permitting.

How to Plan a Neighbourhood Gathering:

- 1. Determine the size & type.
- 2. Pick a location.
- 3. Decide on the time & date (road closures can take place between 9AM-11 PM.
- 4. Plan activities.
- 5. Submit an application to the Town.

Community Safety Reminders

Seasonal Property Maintenance Reminder - Special Advisory

As we move into the summer months, the Town of White City would like to remind all property owners of their responsibility to maintain their properties in accordance with The Community Standards Bylaw.

To help keep our community looking its best, grass and weeds must be trimmed regularly and kept below 20 centimetres in height. Neglected properties can create a range of concerns, including:

- Fire hazards, particularly during hot, dry weather;
- · Attracting rodents and reptiles; and
- The spread of invasive weeds to neighbouring properties.

The Town will be monitoring properties for compliance. If a property is found to be non-compliant, the Town may take corrective action at the owner's expense.

We all have a role to play in protecting and enhancing our community. Thank you for doing your part to keep White City safe and beautiful this summer!

Public Works

Upcoming Projects & Reminders As we gear up for summer, our team is busy working to keep White City looking its best.

Here's what Public Works has on the schedule:

- Splash Park: Our team is preparing the park for its official opening on Saturday, June 7 during Summer Sizzle.
- Tree Trimming: Trimming is ongoing in parks, along walking trails, and in fire lanes to maintain visibility and safety.
- Road Repairs: Crews will continue to patch potholes and seal road cracks to improve road safety and comfort. Please be mindful of signage, pylons and staff working along the roads. Stay alert and drive with care.
- Gopher Control: Another round of gopher control may take place if required. Pellets will be placed directly into gopher holes. The product used will not harm pets.
- Leaf Bag Pickup and Spring Clean Up Bins ended in May. Both services will return in October. In the meantime, please dispose of waste through the appropriate residential bin.

Important Reminders:

- As you set up your irrigation system for the season, please make sure it's working properly. Checking for leaks now will save you money on your water bill!
- Please don't plant on municipal land or public reserves all trees and landscaping must stay within your property lines.
- No cutting or trimming Elm trees between April 1 and August 31. This is an easy and important way to help prevent the spread of Dutch Elm Disease.

Weekly Compost Pick-Up

Weekly curbside compost collection is back! Until October, Loraas will pick up your yard waste and organics every Tuesday, so make sure your compost bin is out by 7 am. 2025 collection schedules are available at the Town Office or on our website.





- Store your bin in a shady and well- location
- Set your bin out for collection, even if it isn't full
- Cover layers of food waste with yard waste like dried leaves or grass clippings
- Use a compostable bin liner
- Sprinkle a little vinegar or baking soda in your bin to reduce odour
- Rinse your bin occasionally with a garden hose

SEASONAL PERMITS & INSPECTIONS

It's almost summer, and that means it's time to dust off your tools and bring those outdoor projects to life! Whether you're planting a new garden, building a deck, or installing a pool, a little planning goes a long way. Before you get started, make sure you have the right permits in place to keep your project safe, compliant, and stress-free. Following the rules helps protect our community, our environment, and your investment.

Here's what you need to know before you dig in.

Landscaping Permits & Inspections - May 30 to September 30

Attention all green thumbs! Before you start landscaping, remember to submit a landscaping permit to the Town — your design must meet certain standards to support White City's natural drainage plan. Some subdivisions also have extra landscaping rules, so be sure to check our website for details: whitecity.ca/p/driveways-landscaping-fences.

Pro tip: Choosing trees? Visit our Urban Forest Management page for guidance: whitecity. ca/p/urban-forest-management-strategy

Once your permit is approved and your work is done, give your grass and sod time to take root. Meanwhile, don't forget to plant all trees and install a hard-surface driveway.

When everything is complete, request a landscaping inspection (available May 30 to September 30) by emailing townoffice@whitecity.ca.

Swimming Pool Permits, Inspections and Fills

Make a splash — safely! The Private Swimming Pool Bylaw (Bylaw No. 667-21) requires permits for new pools and pool demolitions and outlines safety rules for fences, gates and covers.

New pools also need an inspection. Never had your pool inspected before? Send an email to townoffice@whitecity.ca and we'll get one scheduled.



General Permitting Reminders

Spent the winter daydreaming about a new deck, driveway, solar panel, fence, or accessory building? You'll need a permit. Visit whitecity.ca/p/permits to get started.



Golf Cart & ATV Safety

With sunny skies and rising temperatures, it's no surprise that many residents are eager to bring out their seasonal vehicles and make the most of the summer. Whether you're cruising in a golf cart or an ATV, safety must come first — for your sake and for the entire community.

While it is legal to drive golf carts on public roads, specific rules must be followed under The Golf Cart Bylaw. Key requirements include:

- Drivers must hold a minimum of a Class 7 driver's license
- Owners must carry sufficient insurance
- Golf carts can only be operated during daylight hours
- Cannot be capable at operating over 24 km/h
- Must not operate on provincial highways, multi-use pathways, or roads with a speed limit over 50 km/h

All-terrain vehicles (ATVs), dirt bikes, and side-by-sides fall under both the Off-Road Vehicle Bylaw and the Saskatchewan All-Terrain Vehicles Act. Compliance with these regulations is essential, not only for legal reasons, but also to prevent serious accidents.

Violating these bylaws comes at a steep cost. Penalties may include heavy fines, license suspensions, vehicle impoundment, and even charges under the Traffic Safety Act and the Criminal Code of Canada – especially when reckless behaviour, like stunting, puts others at risk.

Before heading out, take a few minutes to review the Golf Cart Bylaw (Bylaw No. 693-23) and the Off-Road Vehicle Bylaw (Bylaw No. 669-21). Please drive responsibly; let's all do our part to keep this summer safe, fun, and free from preventable incidents.
