New Winter Fun at Double K Recreation Facility

This winter marks the first season residents can enjoy several exciting upgrades at the Double K Recreation Facility — designed to expand winter recreation options for all ages and abilities.

Crokicurl Comes to Double K

The skating pad will be transformed into a Crokicurl pad this season! Crokicurl combines elements of curling and crokinole and is played in shoes. This new addition is inspired by successful programs in other municipalities and offers a fun, accessible winter activity for those who may not enjoy or be able to skate.

Learn to Crokicurl will be incorporated into Family Skate nights, with Town staff onsite to help you try it out and answer questions. All equipment is provided.

Skating Trail

We're also introducing a new skating trail this winter. The trail starts at Double K Rink and winds through the park, similar to skating loops found in communities like Echo Valley. The trail will be lit for evening skating using existing lighting and flooded regularly to provide safe, high-quality ice.

The Town proudly maintains three outdoor skating rinks for everyone to enjoy. For the latest updates, visit the rink pages on our website:

To help keep our rinks in great shape, please pick up after yourself and consider scraping the ice after extended use. Maintenance schedules may vary as Town crews balance rink upkeep with other winter priorities such as roadway clearing.

Skating times are not supervised by Town staff. All outdoor rinks close at 10:00 pm sharp every night, at which time lights will shut off automatically. Please be respectful of the community and nearby neighbourhoods and homeowners.

Outdoor rinks are a shared community space, and all users are expected to be mindful and share the ice with fellow skaters. Shinny may be permitted during public skate time if no other users are present. Occasionally, Double K Rink is rented out for private usage. Signs will be posted in these instances. During private rentals, the Skating Trail and Crokicurl pad will remain open for public use.

Council News

New Platform for Meeting Livestreams

The Town of White City is committed to transparency, accessibility, and keeping residents connected and informed. As part of this commitment, we are transitioning to a new and improved platform for livestreaming Council and Committee Meetings.

The livestream link can be found with each meeting's agenda on the Town's CivicWeb Portal: whitecity.civicweb.net/Portal.

If you need assistance navigating the new system, step-by-step instructions are available at whitecity.ca/p/meeting-livestreams.

Please note:

- You do not need a Microsoft Teams account to view the livestreams. You can watch using your web browser.
- Viewers will not be able to use their microphone or camera during the livestream.
- The livestream has a 15 second delay.

New Committee Structure

Council has established five new subcommittees to act as informal working groups and provide strategic input, guidance and review before items are forwarded to the Committee of the Whole for broader Council consideration. Subcommittee meetings will not be livestreamed, but they will be open to the public and recordings will be uploaded to the Town's CivicWeb Portal.

Government Relations Subcommittee: Supports Council's efforts to build strong, strategic relationships with other governments, elected officials and sector partners. Acts as a forum to coordinate advocacy efforts, set shared priorities, and represent the Town in intergovernmental discussions.

Corporate Services Subcommittee: Provides strategic input on matters related to financial management, corporate administration, risk mitigation and internal business operations.

Community Services Subcommittee: Guides the development and continuous improvement of community-facing services, including recreation, community programming, operational public works, and municipal communications.

Community Planning and Development Subcommittee: Provides oversight on matters related to land use planning, development regulation and municipal infrastructure planning.

Protective Services Subcommittee: Supports Council's strategic oversight of services that contribute to a safe and well-managed community, including bylaw enforcement, fire protection, emergency preparedness, and regional safety partnerships.

Civic Meeting Schedule


At their December 8, 2025 meeting, Council adopted the civic meeting schedule for 2026.

The schedule includes:

- 13 Regular Council Meetings: Regular Council Meetings will be held at 7:00 p.m. every four weeks.
- 23 Committee Meetings: Committee Meetings will be held bi-weekly alternating between 4:00 p.m. and 7:00 p.m.
- 18 Sub-Committee Meetings: Four meetings are scheduled for each of Corporate Services, Community Services, Community Planning and Development, and Protective Services.

 Two meetings are scheduled for Government Relations. Sub-Committee Meetings will be held quarterly on Mondays alternating between 1:00 p.m. and 3:00 p.m. unless other dates or times are determined by Council.

Draft 2026 Budget

During the December 8, 2025 Committee of the Whole Meeting, Council received an initial presentation of the proposed 2026 Annual Budget, which aims to balance investment in staff, infrastructure and community programs while maintaining affordability.

The draft budget outlines \$9.717M in revenues, \$9.710M in expenses, and a projected surplus of \$0.007M. It includes \$3.164M in capital grants, \$2.380M in reserves, and a net surplus of \$0.0008M.

Key Assumptions:

- Construction of 13 new homes and 2 show homes.
- Development levies of approximately \$833.3K from three major projects.
- A 3.0% inflation rate.
- A 4.0% mill rate increase and a \$100 increase to the base tax.
- No changes to the 2026 utility rate structure. A 2.3% increase to non-residential water rates, but no increase for residential users, and a \$3 monthly reduction to sewer charges.
- A 4% overall wage increase and five new positions.
- No new debt issuance for 2026.

Planning & Development

Business Licenses

If you own a business in White City — big or small — this is your friendly reminder to make sure you're properly licensed and your information is up to date.

Already have your business license? Renewals are due February 28, 2026.

New to the process? Initial Business Applications are accepted anytime.

A few important points:

- Home-Based Business: If you're working from home, your business needs Council approval and must comply with zoning regulations. If your business has changed or you haven't applied yet, you'll need to submit a new application.
- Annual Business License: Every business needs to renew their business license each year. If
 you've missed a year or haven't been renewing consistently, you'll need to re-apply with the
 Town.





DEVELOPMENT UPDATES

BOUNDRY ALTERATION & BRIGHT COMMUNITIES DEVELOPMENT (THE MEADOWS)

Location: Land directly east of White City, identified as a future growth area for the Town.

The Town receieved a formal request from the landowners of Epona Farms to adjust the municipal boundary. This change would bring approximately 504 acres of land from the RM of Edenwold into White City for a new residential development called The Meadows, developed by Bright Communities Ltd.

The developer envisions a vibrant residential neighbourhood with single-family homes and luxury townhomes, and no purpose-built rentals or buildings over two storys. Most lots would be about one-third of an acre, similar to the neighbourhood around Emerald Ridge Elementary School. Approximately 15% of the total area would be dedicated to green space and a 10-metre municipal buffer would be

added next to existing RM of Edenwold acreages, in addition to natural setbacks. Townhomes are expected to start at \$400.0K-\$500.0K, with single family homes projected at \$700.0K-\$750.0K.

The Town has been negotiating a Boundary Alteration Agreement with the RM of Edenwold. On December 16, the RM's Council passed a motion to issue a complementary resolution. This means the Town and the RM will move forward in a collaborative process to transfer the land to White City.

In the meantime, the Town is updating its Official Community Plan to designate the area as Future Urban Residential. This change will align planning documents with the RM of Edenwold, which already identifies these lands as Residential in their Future Land Use Map. A Public Hearing on this amendment will be held January 5, 2026.

TOWNHOMES OF ROYAL PARK - PARCELS X AND Z

Location: North of existing Royal Park homes and south of Betteridge Road.

Royal Park Real Estate GP Inc. submitted a Comprehensive Development Proposal, which Council approved in principle on October 27, 2025.

The development includes two phases of 100 units each. Phase 1 includes four- and six- unit townhomes with garages underneath and stacked townhomes of 20, 24 or 28 units. The unit mix includes one-, two- and three-bedroom homes, all with exterior entrances. Construction is targeted for late summer or fall 2026, with substantial completion of Phase 1 in 2027. The first phase is projected to house approximately 200 residents.

At the November 10, 2025 Regular Council Meeting, Council recommended the Community Planning Branch of the Ministry of Government Relations approve subdividing the lands into two residential parcels (Parcels X and Z) and two municipal reserves.

To move forward, updates to the Town's Official Community Plan and Zoning Bylaw No. 581-14 are required. Council gave first reading to these amendments at the December 8, 2025 Regular Council Meeting. The proposed amendments will be advertised before a public hearing on January 5, 2026.

PARCELY DISCRETIONARY USE APPLICATION

Location: Southeast of Highway 1/Highway 48 intersection, along Gregory Avenue East (next to McKenzie Pointe).

Parcel Y is zoned Highway Commercial/Industrial (HCI). Mauri Gwynn Developments Ltd. submitted a discretionary use application proposing two three-story mixed-use

buildings with a daycare and commercial space on the main floors and 40 total residential units above.

When a proposed development includes a discretionary use, Council is required under *The Planning* and *Development Act, 2007* to review it. The Town is required to consider these applications, but doing so does not imply support or opposition. It simply ensures the process is fair, transparent, and follows provincial legislation.

At the November 10, 2025 Regular Council Meeting, Council denied the descretionary use application because it did not meet conditions previously set by Council, including requirements for community consultation. The Town anticipates a new proposal from the developer in 2026.

Public Works

Upcoming Projects & Reminders

The Public Works Department has a busy season ahead! As winter settles in, crews are working hard to keep our community safe and running smoothly. Here's what residents can expect over the coming months:

Winter Operations:

- Rink Maintenance: Crews will continue maintaining the outdoor rinks throughout the winter season, weather permitting.
- Snow Clearing: Public Works will be actively clearing snow from roads and public areas to ensure safe travel conditions.
- Christmas Tree Pickup: Christmas tree collection will take place January 5–9. Please place your tree at the edge of the road if you would like Public Works to collect it.
- Spring Preparation: Beginning in March, crews will start clearing drainage channels and exposing culvert ends in preparation for the spring melt.

Here are a few important seasonal reminders Public Works would like to share with residents:

Sewer Caps: Please check that the sewer cap in your front yard or driveway is secure and not broken or missing. Damaged or missing caps can lead to frozen sewer lines. The town is not responsible for thawing resident sewer lines.

Garbage & Recycling Bin Placement: Ensure bins are placed on your own property, not on the roadway (see the image below for an example). This helps crews clear snow safely and efficiently. Loraas trucks have a 9-foot reach, so they'll have no trouble reaching your bin.

Snow Placement: Do not shovel or blow snow onto the road or road edge. This can create ice buildup and driving hazards, especially during melt periods. All snow should be placed on your own property.

Thank you for your cooperation and for helping Public Works keep our community safe and accessible throughout the winter season.

Winter Driving

As winter conditions settle in, please remember to reduce your speed when roads are icy or visibility is poor. Even familiar routes can become slippery, so take extra care and leave plenty of space between your vehicle and the one ahead.

With snow and ice on the roads, basic driving rules become more important than ever:

- Eyes on the road
- Hands on the wheel
- Phones down and attention up

Let's all do our part to keep our roads safe this winter. Drive smart, stay alert, and get to your destination safely.



Safe Operation of Snowmobiles

The operation of Snowmobiles is permitted in Town under limited circumstances. Ensure that you are following the Town's *Off-Road Vehicle Bylaw* and the Provincial *Snowmobile Act* before riding your Snowmobile.

You can only ride a Snowmobile in Town:

- On private property with permission from the land owner;
- Taking the most direct route to and from your property to travel outside of town; and
- On the farthest right-hand portion of the road.

Off-Road Vehicles are not allowed on Town land, public reserve land, parks, buffer strips, walkways and crown-owned land. Multi-Use Pathways are only intended for non-motorized usage & pedestrians. Never ride your Off-Road Vehicle on the Town's pathways. Operation of snowmobiles on Provincial Highways is only permitted to safely cross the highway; you should travel in the ditch area along Provincial Highways.

Responsible Pet Ownership

Pets bring so much joy to our homes — and with that joy comes a shared responsibility to keep our community safe, respectful, and welcoming for everyone.

Leashes Keep Everyone Safe

In White City, dogs must always be under their owner's control — either on a leash or securely contained on your property. As there are currently no off-leash dog parks in town, all dogs must remain leashed in parks and public spaces. Please ensure the person holding the leash can physically control the dog. Even the friendliest pets can act unpredictably, and not everyone is comfortable around animals. A leash protects your dog and shows courtesy to your neighbours.

Let's Keep the Peace

We all love our pets, but excessive barking can be disruptive. Barking or howling is considered a nuisance when it persists 15 minutes or longer OR intermittently for an hour or more. If your dog is barking continuously, especially late at night, please bring them indoors. Managing barking helps maintain the calm, peaceful environment we all value.

Keep Cats Close to Home

To help protect both pets and wildlife, cats are not permitted to roam freely in the neighbourhood. Please keep your cats indoors or supervise them in a secure, enclosed outdoor area.

Don't Forget to Register!

If a new furry friend joined your family over the holidays, be sure to register them with the Town Office. Pet registration helps ensure compliance with local bylaws and makes it much easier to reunite you with your pet if they ever go missing. 
