Council Summaries

January 8, 2024 - Committee of the Whole

The Consent Agenda included approving minutes from a previous meeting and addressing queries about an IT invoice covering both services and Microsoft Licensing Fees. The Government Relations Subcommittee proposal was discussed, outlining its purpose and composition, but the Committee decided to defer the matter for broader discussions on the overall structure of Committees/Council meetings. The meeting also delved into a follow up report on the Total Compensation Review, with additional research on benefits and vacation leave, with the final report recommended for Council approval. Lastly, the Bylaw Enforcement Policy, revised to accommodate the new Community Safety Officer program, raised questions about practices in other Saskatchewan municipalities, prompting further work by Administration.

January 8, 2024 - Regular Council Meeting

The Consent Agenda covered routine items, including minutes, correspondence, and account ratification, with Councillors posing queries about the Integrity Commissioner Report and the process of handling of Council Code of Ethics complaints. The Town Manager provided updates on ongoing projects, such as the WCRM158 Wastewater Expansion Project, Planning and Development, and meetings with government officials. In New Business, Council ensured compliance with eligibility requirements for the Municipal Revenue Sharing Grant from the Ministry of Government Relations. The roundtable allowed Council members to share updates, including plans for the White City Museum's AGM. The AVANA Comprehensive Development Proposal, tentatively approved in principle, and a closed session on long-term planning related to a pending Boundary Alteration Appeal Decision concluded the meeting.



January 22, 2024 - Committee of the Whole

The Consent Agenda included minutes, accounts, and bank reconciliation, with Committee members inquiring about an unplanned transmission replacement in the Public Works fleet. Administration clarified that the unit, received as a donation from TC Energy, required repairs due to its age and mileage, with overall maintenance costs over the last 3 years totaling approximately \$12.5K. Next, the Committee reviewed the Fee Bylaw Amendment, Committee members asked questions about why some fees needed an increase to which Administration provided information that costs to facilitate the service have increased. It was recommended for Council approval. The Bylaw Enforcement Policy, revisited from the January 8th meeting, underwent revisions excluding a section on anonymous complaints, and further research revealed few Saskatchewan municipalities have implemented this type of policy, leading the Committee to table the item. During the Roundtable, the White City Museum's upcoming AGM and Councillor Hal Zorn's update on a Wastewater Authority mediation meeting were discussed. The meeting concluded with an in-camera session to discuss Prairie Valley School Division's recently released major priorities.

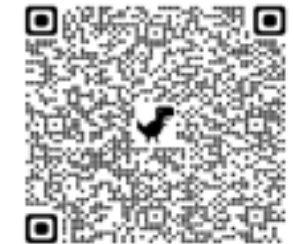

REGISTER YOUR PETS

Contact the Town Office to register your pet. It's a bylaw but more importantly, it can reunite you with that family member who sometimes eats your favourite shoes, but you can't help but love 'em anyway.

LEASHES REQUIRED

Whether you're taking Fido out for their daily stroll or trying out a new cat-leash, your pets must be leashed at all times when out and about. It's not only important in order to keep your pet safe, but others' too.

PICK UP AFTER YOUR POOCH

No one likes stepping in a fresh (or frozen) pile of dog poop and it's easily preventable. Carry some extra baggies with you on walks with your dog and take two seconds to save someone's shoes!

DON'T LET CATS ROAM

Although your feline may be feeling adventurous, it's important to put their safety first. Many cats get lost, go missing, or can be hurt from cars and coyotes. Keep your cats where they are loved: at home!

Public Works staff has been busy throughout January flooding and clearing the outdoor rinks for public use.

The mild weather that we left in 2023 prevented rinks from being in their best shape for the start of winter, but as we trudged through a cold snap in January, our crews were able to get all the outdoor rinks up and running.

The Ecole White City, Double K, and Pond skating surfaces are all now open!

Please do your part to keep our rinks clean and tidy by picking up after yourself.

In the winter months when snow clearing is added to the Public Work schedule, it's important for the path of our snow plows to be clear so they can operate effectively. Although we appreciate your effort to put your bins as close to the collection truck as possible, it is actually preferred when your bin is placed 6 inches (or so) off asphalt edge on your property. The Loraas truck that lifts the bins has an arm that can reach up to 9 inches so don't worry about your bin being out of reach! This small adjustment to your garbage and recycling bin placement greatly helps snow clearing efforts of Public Works staff and we appreciate your cooperation!

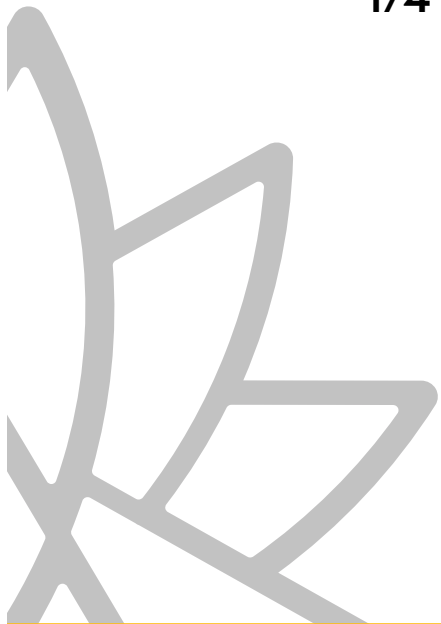
